

STUDENT CONTESTS 2nd Edition

The project involves a two-step contest (first national then multinational) to award the best students and young chemists producing an original product (power point presentations, video, poster) presenting to different audiences (to children, secondary (lower and upper), university students and to the general public) the solutions that chemistry is able to provide to free choice sectors of modern society (energy, food, health, water, transport, new technologies, etc.).

Competition among students is open to students of Chemistry, Industrial Chemistry and Chemical Engineering I, II, III cycle and high school students. The competition takes place in two stages:

- 1) National
- 2) International

Step 1: National

The original products will be posted to the web address <http://ecampus.chem.auth.gr/contests>) containing the name of the author/s, the name of the School/University, the type of program used (Power Point, Quicktime or every other program) . On the website the artworks will be divided according to different types of audience. The various categories of students and the general public will vote on the same site the best artwork in each category. All the participants will receive a certificate while the 6 most voted works will receive a diploma and a small gadget.

Step 2: International

Three of the 6 winning works at the national level will be selected by a committee made up of the national leaders of the project . The three selected works will be translated into English and posted on the website for voting by of all categories of students and the public of all countries participating to the. The authors (an author to award-winning artwork) of the 3 top artworks, selected by a Commission made up of all the national coordinators taking into account both the votes and the criteria reported in the contest rules, will receive a diploma and will be invited to attend the ECTN General Assembly and their expenses totally charged to the ECTN.
